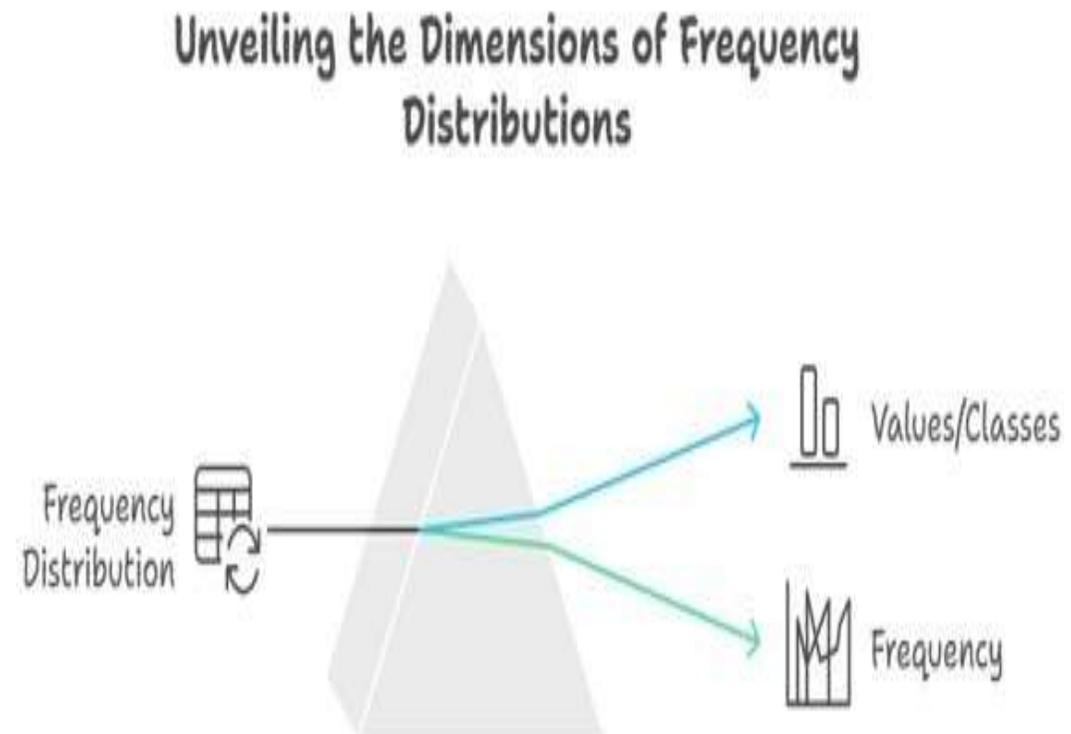

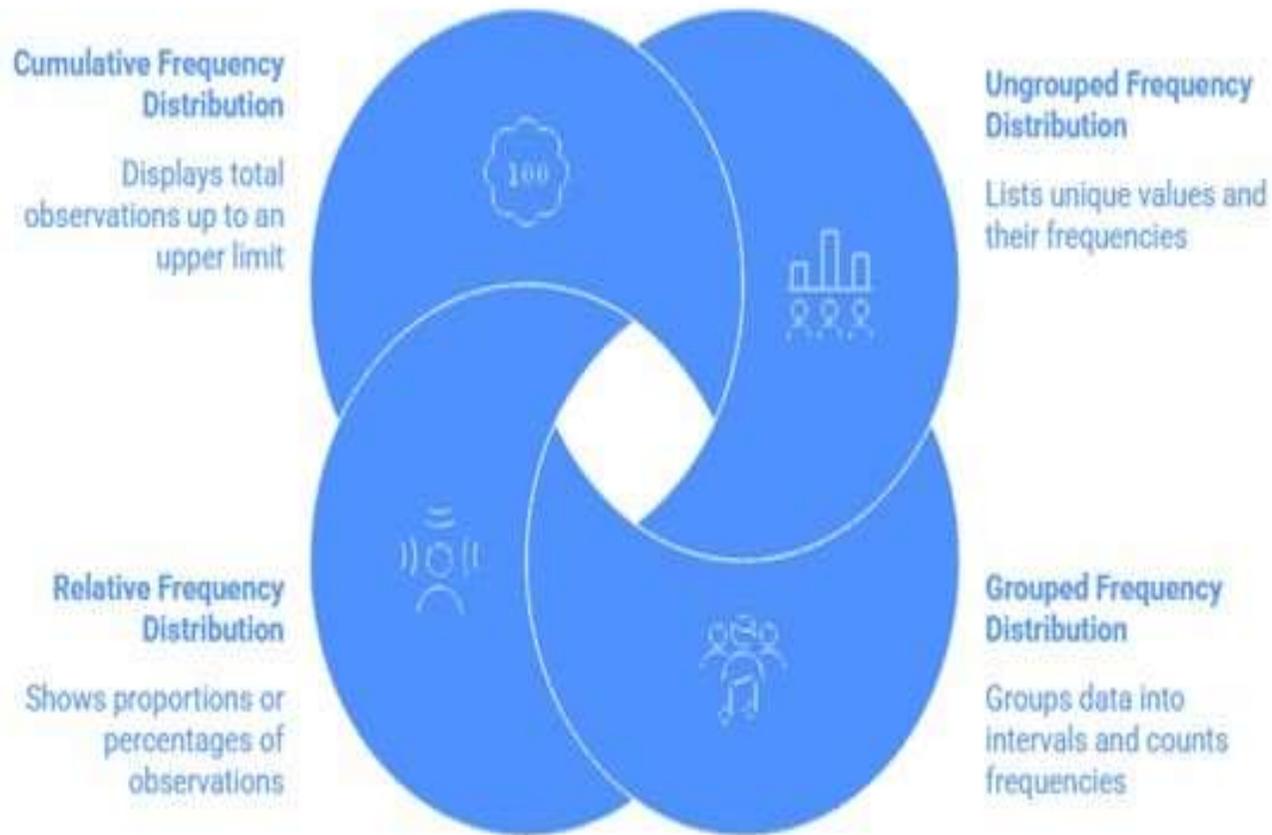

Types
Different forms of frequency distributions

- A **frequency distribution** is a table or chart that summarizes the values and their frequencies for a set of data. It shows how often each value or range of values occurs in the dataset.
- In simpler terms, it's a way of organizing data to see the pattern of how frequently different values appear.

Example Sum : Constructing a Grouped Frequency Distribution

Let's say we have the following dataset representing the scores of 30 students on a test:

65, 70, 72, 75, 78, 80, 82, 85, 88, 90, 92, 95, 68, 73, 76, 79, 81, 83, 86, 89, 91, 93, 96, 67, 71, 74, 77, 84, 87, 94

1.Range: $96 - 65 = 31$

2.Number of Classes: Let's choose 6 classes.

3.Class Width: $31 / 6 \approx 5.17$. We'll round this up to 6.

4.Class Boundaries:

1. 65-70
2. 71-76
3. 77-82
4. 83-88
5. 89-94
6. 95-100

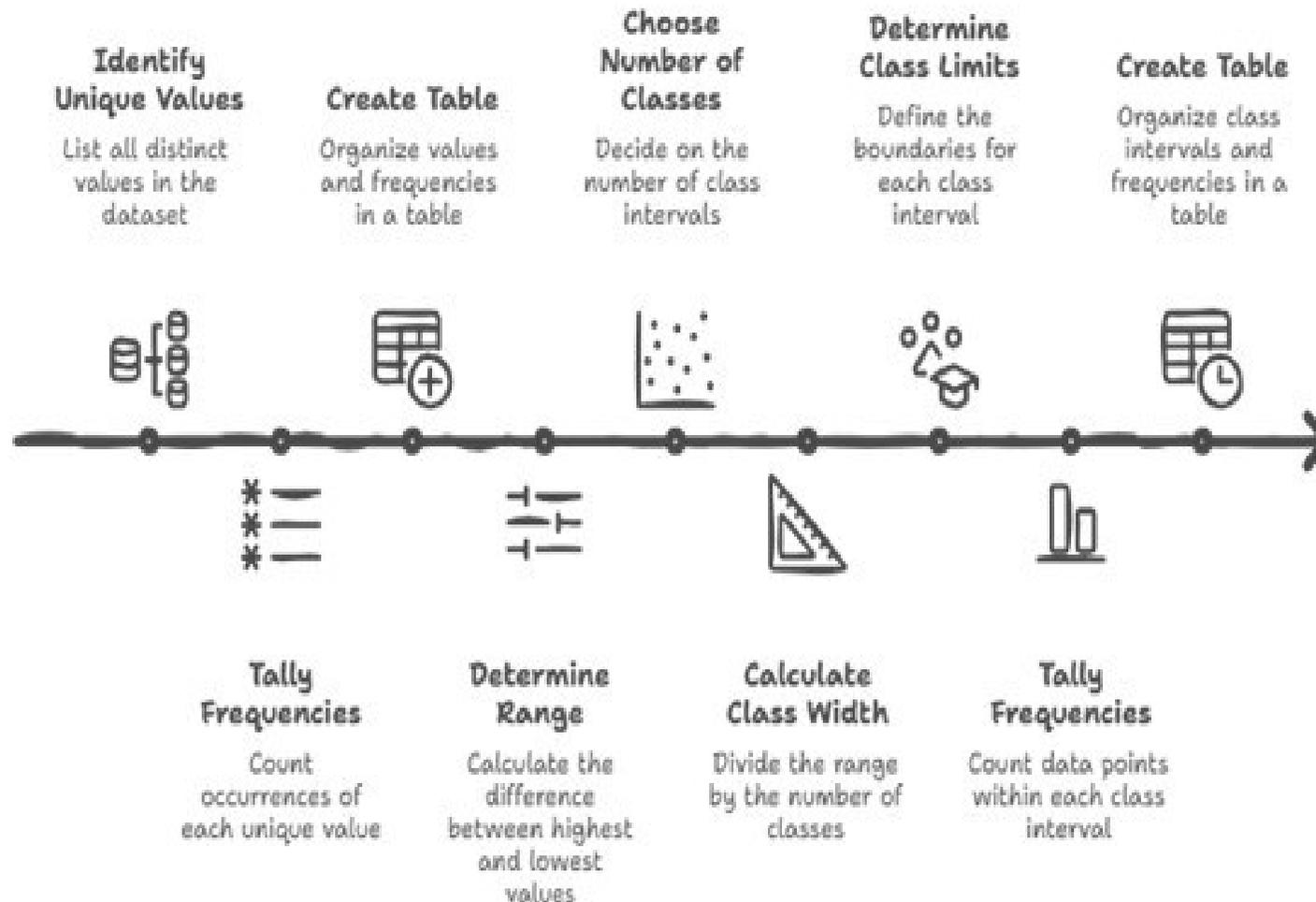
5.Tally Frequencies:

- * 65-70: 4
- * 71-76: 5
- * 77-82: 6
- * 83-88: 5
- * 89-94: 6
- * 95-100: 4

6.Frequency Distribution Table:

Class	Frequency	Relative Frequency	Cumulative Frequency
65-70	4	0.133	4
71-76	5	0.167	9
77-82	6	0.200	15
83-88	5	0.167	20
89-94	6	0.200	26
95-100	4	0.133	30

Constructing a Frequency Distribution



FREQUENCY DISTRIBUTIONS – FUN ACTIVITIES

1. Collect & Classify

Time: 10–15 minutes

Mode: Individual → Group

Steps:

- Ask students to collect one variable (e.g., marks, heights, mobile usage hours).
- Write raw data on the board.
- Students:
 - Decide class intervals
 - Create a frequency table

 **Outcome:** Understanding raw data → frequency distribution

Pie Chart

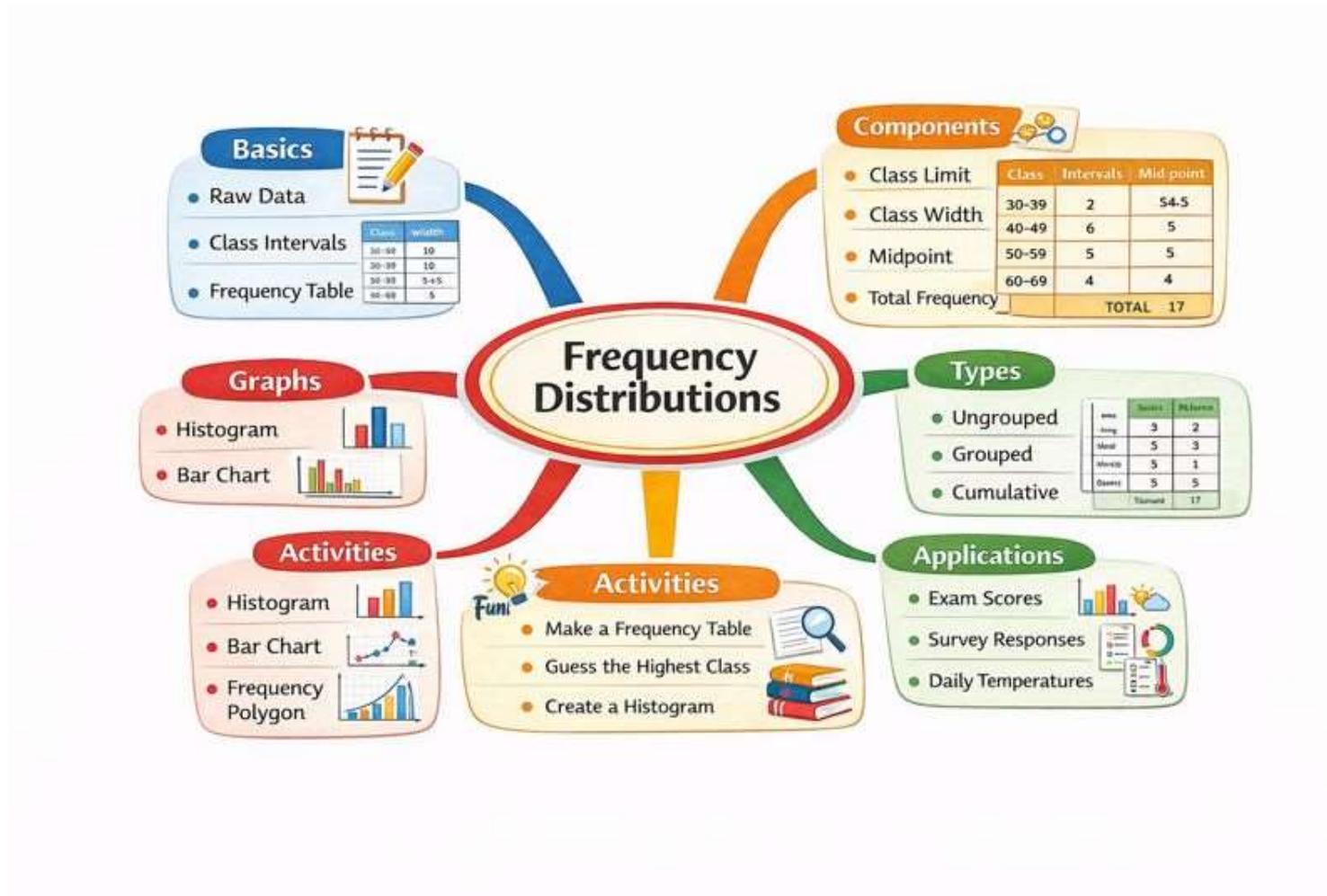
Circular chart with slices for relative frequencies



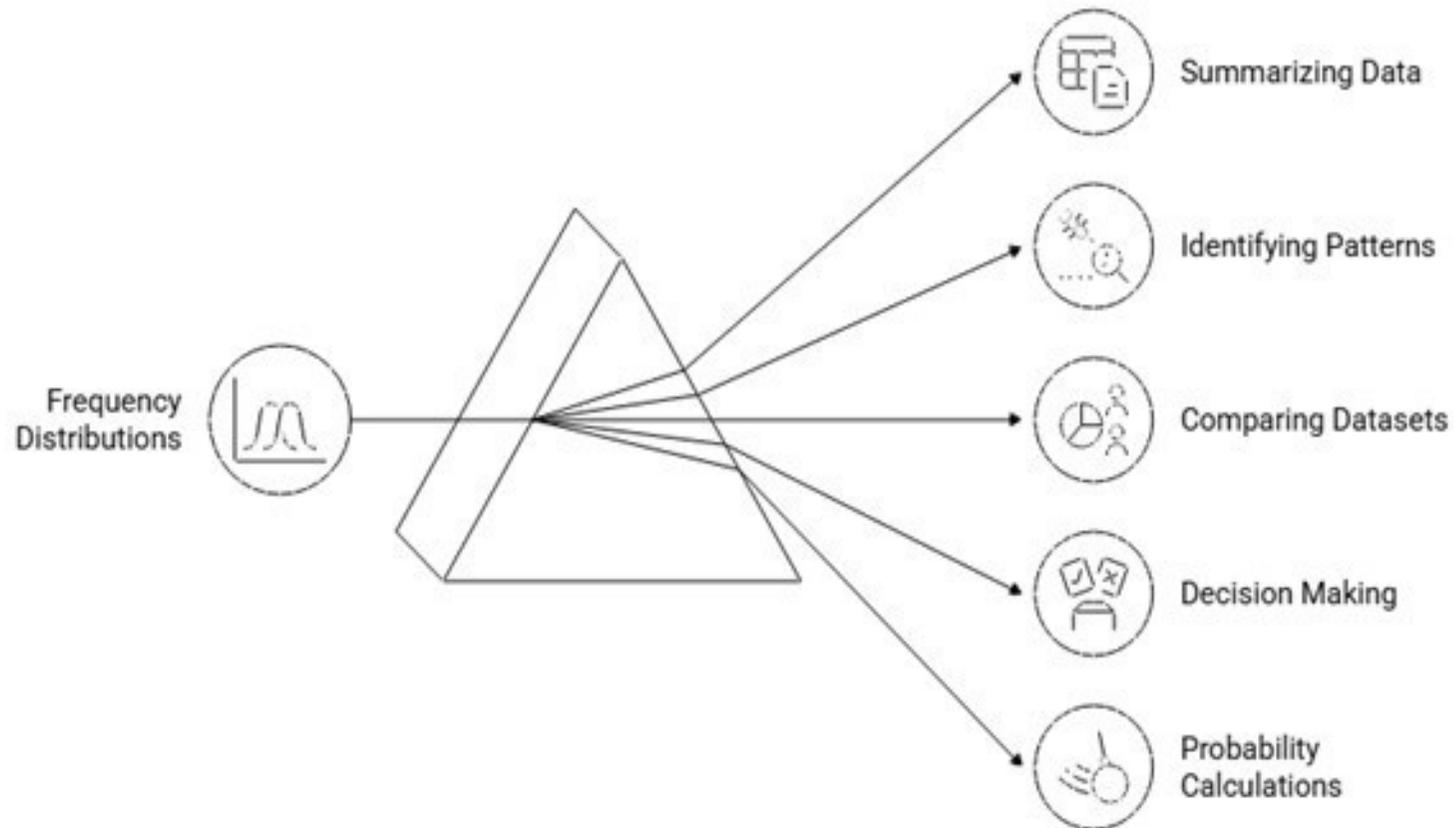
Ogive
