Financial Requirements: Startup Costs

Rent/Purchase

\$5,000 - \$15,000/month, varies by location

Inventory Investment

\$50,000 - \$150,000 initial stock of medications

Licenses & Permits

\$1,000 - \$5,000 depending on state regulations

Tech & Legal Fees

\$5,000 - \$20,000 for software and hardware; \$2,000 - \$10,000 legal consulting



Financial Requirements: Operational Expenses

Staff Salaries

- Pharmacist: \$120,000 - \$150,000/year
- Technicians: \$35,000 - \$50,000/year

Other Costs

- Inventory replenishment: \$20,000 - \$80,000/month
- Utilities: \$500 - \$2,000/month
- Insurance: \$3,000 - \$10,000/year
- Marketing: \$500 - \$3,000/month



Materials Management: Inventory Control

Medication Types

Brand name and generic prescription drugs plus OTC products

Medical Supplies

Bandages, syringes, and other essential healthcare items

Inventory Software

Automated reordering and stock tracking systems

Security

Secure storage rooms and alarm systems to prevent theft

Staffing Requirements: Training and Development

1 Continuing Education

Pharmacists earn ACPE credits regularly for license renewal

2 Certification

Technicians complete PTCB or ExCPT certification programs

3 Customer Service Skills

Effective communication enhances patient experience

4 Compliance Training

HIPAA and confidentiality are critical requirements
