







## Pharmacy Organizational Structure Benefits









## Inpatient Pharmacy Structure






## Sterile Compounding Area Responsibilities





# DIRECT PATIENT CARE SERVICES VS CLINICAL PHARMACY EXPERTISE IN HOSPITAL PHARMACY






# Pharmacy Technician Role in Hospital Pharmacy






